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



The College of Arts and Sciences, in its 56<sup>th</sup> year of existence, is not only a partner of the university in academic endeavors but also in extension activities.

As such, the college conducted several activities and programs which were implemented by the different academic programs together with the four departments. Said activities and programs were geared to address the needs, issues, and concerns of the beneficiaries based on the results of the needs assessment survey and the requests of partner agencies.

In the second half of the year 2021, particularly the last two months with the easing down of the IATF protocols on the COVID-19 pandemic, the college had a more viable climate in undertaking extension endeavors.

Faculty members of the Academic Programs and the General Education Courses have been remarkably active in the conduct of extension activities to the different communities and adopted schools of the college.

The Master of Arts in Guidance and Counseling conducted an activity entitled "Team Building Activity for Philippine Statistics Authority" on December 23, 2021, at Ban-aw Resort, Candon City, Ilocos Sur. The recipients of the activity were the Region I Philippine Statistics Authority personnel. The activity focused on mental health and stress management in the workplace. This is a joint extension activity with UNP Guidance and Counseling Services and Information and Orientation Services unit.

The BS Marine Biology Program conducted activities on the traditional and cultural practices in managing coastal and marine resources through women's participation at Nalvo, Sta. Maria, Ilocos Sur and at the Gawad Kalinga Site at San Sebastian, San Vicente, Ilocos Sur on December 9-10, 2021. The highlights of the activity were lectures on coastal resources of Ilocos Sur (mangroves, seagreass, and coral reef), women's participation in the fishing industry, tradition and culture in fishing practices, and good practices in managing coastal and marine resources.

The BS Psychology program extended its services as a resource speaker and trainer for webinar training for police officers in Region 1 as part of the program's Project Hiraya. The topics include Mental Health Awareness, Stress Debriefing Techniques, and Psychological First Aid. The activity mainly aimed to raise awareness about mental health. It aimed to make the police officers understand its components, its aspects, as well as the mental health continuum. This webinar training also aimed to teach Police Officers basic stress coping strategies, which are vital in managing the stress brought about by the pandemic.

Physics Salindunong is an extension program of the BS Physics. It primarily aims to capacitate the teachers and students of the adopted schools of the college in the proper use of the available science laboratory instruments, conducting an investigatory project, writing an action research, among others. on December 12-13, 2021, the program monitored and gave lectures on how to write the research methodology.

Espousing the concept of "teaching-on-air," the Department of Languages and Humanities conducted radio programs with the hope of reaching more participants/listeners for their planned activities. On November 29, 2021, the DLH conducted an extension activity through the radio Station of the university DWNP, entitled, Tangguyob: Hatid Dunong: Abot-Tulong. 

#### Graduate Programs Hold Financial Literacy Training by Dr. Princess Neptalia Quebral







#### PROJECT TECHI KICKS OFF AT FES

University Extension Office launched Project TECHI, or the Teacher Engaged in Computers Heighten Innovations, in December 2021. This project was intended for the Fuerte Elementary School Teachers and aimed at assisting elementary school teachers in their needs relevant to delivering instructions using computers, among others. As a primer for this project, a three-day training workshop was conducted to enhance their computer technical skills on December 13 to 15, 2021.

#### Day 1

The team arrived at 8:00 in the morning and was welcomed by the teachers, non-teaching staff, and the principal of Fuerte Elementary School. The training started with an opening program wherein the trainers and facilitators were introduced to the participants. The relevance and importance of the said training was emphasized to the participants.

The training workshop started after the opening program. Mr. Joseph G. Acena discussed and

















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introduced to the participants all about "Gearing Up with Google Workspace for Education." The participants had an overview with regards to google. He also discussed google drive and its features like creating files, accessing files, organizing files, working with office files and other non-google files, uploading files, converting files, offline access to drive files, sharing files with specific people, sharing non-google files, sharing files as a link, creating and managing folders in google drive and sharing a resource folder in drive.

In the afternoon, the same trainer/lecturer discussed "Turning F2F to Virtual: Manage the Google Classroom," wherein he talked about setting up the classroom classes, adding students to the classroom roster using a class code, inviting students to the classroom, creating the classroom roster with groups and contacts, communicating in the classroom stream, completing an assignment in the classroom, setting a due date for classroom assignments, adding links, videos, and files to the classroom assignments, adding drive files to the classroom assignments, making a copy for each student, viewing assignments, viewing classroom docs before turn in and other features in the google classroom. After the lecture, the participants were given a chance to create and explore the google classroom, wherein they learned its features. They also successfully created their google classroom through the supervision of trainers and facilitators.











#### Day 2

On the 2<sup>nd</sup> day, Mr. Randall M. Rabacal discussed and introduced to the participant's Google Docs wherein he discussed creating a google document, sharing a google document, how to collaborate using google docs, directing comments to specific users, adding links to comments, access version history and revert to earlier versions of google docs, reviewing group contributions with comments and version history, and citation tools to avoid plagiarism including footnotes. After the lecture, the participants were given a chance to have hands-on in google docs. The lecturer/ trainer requested the participants to make a sample test in google docs. They were very active during their hands-on, and it is evident that they wanted to learn something new about technologies.

In the afternoon, Mr. Jayson B. Burlaza talked and introduced to the teachers/participants all about google forms. He discussed the features of google forms just, like creating google forms, adding/editing different question types in google forms, choosing a response destination, editing form settings, sending a google form to users, viewing responses, and using google forms for feedback, grading with google forms quizzes, using google forms to collect data, using google forms to collect data, using google forms as a grading rubric and embedding video in google forms. After the lecture, the trainer gave a chance to the participants to have hands-on. After the lecture, the trainer requested the participants to prepare a sample quiz in google forms using their institutional accounts. The trainers and facilitators carefully supervised it while the participants had their workshop.















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#### Day 3

During day 3, in the morning Mr. Joseph G. Acena discussed the google slides wherein he talked about the creation of google slides, inserting and arranging text, shapes, lines, and word art, formatting fonts and colors, creating linked text, changing the background color of slides, inserting images, resizing and cropping, embedding a video in the google slides, adding comments to google slides, directing to specific users, sharing slides, collaborating inside a slideshow and editing speaker notes. The participants were also allowed to open and explore the google slides. The trainer requested the participants to create a tree in the google slides. The trainers and facilitators supervised them in the workshop.

In the afternoon, Mr. Glenn R. Aludino discussed about google meet. He talked about the features of google meet, just like using google meet for online meetings, starting a meet from the computer, creating a meet from the android or IOS device, including dial-in, getting people into the meet with links and calendar, inviting others to meet, sharing the screen with others during a meet and managing bandwidth to maintain call quality on a meet. After the lecture, the participants were allowed to experience and explore google meet, wherein the trainers and facilitators supervised.

After the lecture, the awarding and closing ceremony was held. It was attended by the participants, principal, trainers and facilitators, project initiator, and the Officer-in-charge of the University Extension Office. This was a very effective training program for teachers wherein they learned the different innovations in computer technology. It will significantly help them, especially during this new normal.

The activity, attended by 30 participants, was a follow-up to the series of activities under the same program, which aimed to enable the participants to understand how gender shapes the roles of women and men in society.








#### UEO Conducts Smoking Cessation Webinar for PNP



#### URDO Disseminates Research Outputs

The University Research and Development Office (URDO), in collaboration with the University Extension Office (UEO), spearheaded the conduct of research dissemination in Barangay Nalvo, Sta. Maria Ilocos Sur on November 26, 2021. The results of three completed research studies of URDO under AFFNR, namely Status of Oyster Farming in Ilocos Sur (by Jessy C. Domingo, Maritess R. Raboy, and Jessa R. Cabebe), Ethnomedicinal Uses of Plants in the First District of Ilocos Sur (by Jessy C. Domingo), and Effects of different Lignocellulosic Materials on the Growth and Yield of Oyster Mushroom (by Maritess R. Raboy) were presented to the fisherfolks of Barangay Nalvo, Sta. Maria Ilocos Sur. The researchers presented these studies.

Participants of the activity were fishers, members of women's organizations, Sangguniang Kabataan, and beneficiaries of the Pantawid Pamilyang Pilipino Program (4Ps) who actively participated in the activity. The participants shared their insights on ethnomedicine, sharing some of their indigenous knowledge on the use of medicinal plants. They also shared and asked questions about some folkloric knowledge about mushrooms. The participants also requested more livelihood training programs on mushroom production and establishing an herbary garden for the community. Moreover, the oyster growers also expressed their desire to work with UNP technical personnel to improve their oyster farming practice. Some of their concerns and problems with oyster farming were also raised during the open forum, and they also requested assistance from the university in requesting more technical and financial support from the government, especially from the Department of Agriculture (DA) ad Bureau of Fisheries and Aquatic Resources (BFAR). The growers also wished to be organized as an association.




