



UNP firms up IP-TBM membership

Enhancing Technology Transfer through Intellectual Property and Technology Business Management in the University of Northern Philippines: this is the theme of the memorandum of agreement between UNP and the Department of Science and Technology - Philippine Council for Agriculture, Aquatic and Natural Resources Research and Development (PCAARRD) which was firming up through the unveiling ceremony of the IP-TBM marker held on 23 August 2020.

The ceremony, held via zoom, was attended by officials of the University headed by Dr. Erwin F. Cadorna, UNP President, and Dr. Fatima F. Rocamora, OIC, Vice President For Research and Extension Office; officials of PCAARRD, Mr. Noel Catibog, Director, TTPD – PCAARRD, Dr. Teddy F. Tepora, Program Leader, Sustaining IP – TBM Phase II, and officials from DOST; and Dr. Dionisio S. Bucao, Project Leader, IP – TBM Region 1, MMSU.

The said membership aims to strengthen the capabilities of the Intellectual Property and Technology Business Management office in UNP to enhance technology commercialization. Specifically, the project intends to capacitate technology transfer personnel, enhance technology promotion and commercialization activities of UNP, strengthen linkages and partnerships with various agencies and intensify activities of IP management and technology commercialization.



The Commission on Higher Education (CHED) has given the go signal to the University of Northern Philippines to conduct limited face-to-face internship for Bachelor of Science in Nursing and Bachelor of Science in Midwifery effective Midyear Term 2021.

The certificate of authority is issued thru Joint Memorandum Circular No. 2021- 001 in the conduct of limited face-to-face clinical practicum for BS in Midwifery, and limited face-to-face internship for BS in Nursing.

The CHED-ROI Team led by Dr. Rogelio T. Galera Jr., Director IV, together with Dr. Melquiades Ancheta, Education Supervisor II, and Dr. Mayrose Quezon, Education Supervisor II, awarded the Certificate of Authority to Conduct Limited Face-to-Face Internship to the aforementioned programs on 28 July 2021 at the Romualdo Tadena Hall, UNP. Also present in the awarding of certificate are

UNP Administration headed by Dr. Erwin F. Cadorna, SUC President IV, together with CHED ROI Team led by Dr. Rogelio T. Galera, Jr., Director IV, during the Awarding of Certificate of Authority.

Dr. Erwin F. Cadorna, UNP President; Dr. Rolando B. Navarro, Vice President for Academic Affairs; Dr. Luzviminda Relon, Director, Instruction and Faculty Development; Atty. Gerwin Rabang, OIC-Chief Administrative Office; Dr. Joussef Bermio, Dean of the College of Health Sciences; and Dr. Julieta Guinid, Dean of the College of Nursing.

Moreover, Dr. Galera stated that there are four higher education institutions in Region I, UNP being one, that already received certificates of authority to conduct face-to-face classes and/or internships. He added that CHED, together with DOH, Inter-Agency Task Force (IATF), and the Local Government Unit (LGU) will continuously inspect compliance

among the institutions. He also mentioned that education frontliners and students' vaccination will be prioritized before the start of classes.

Dr. Cadorna also expressed his gratitude to CHED, and to his col-

leagues in the university for their support. He also stated that he already requested for the vaccination of all UNP employees to LGU-Vigan as preparation for the opening of classes.

The UNP- College of Medicine successfully produced new batch of doctors as the Physician Licensure Examination (PLE) result was released last September 24.

The much awaited university's online enrollment system was finally launched. The photo includes the UNP officials during the launching done after the flag ceremony.

Just in time for the opening of classes for the Academic Year 2021-2022, the University of Northern Philippines

launched the first Full Online Enrollment System on 01 September 2021. The launching program held at the

Flagpole area was attended by the University Officials, Academic Deans, and

Directors/Heads of offices.

Dr. Erwin F. Cadorna, UNP President, stated in his message that this initiative is not possible without the cooperation of everyone. He also extended his gratitude to all the members of the Board of Regents for their support to the university.

The enrollment system is one of the major projects of the Cadorna Administration. Same with the LED Wall Project which was inaugurated last March, this recent project is in line with the university's adherence to global standards. This is also a respond to the university's goal for an easier and more accessible process for enrollment.

UNP faculty undergo training program on flexible learning

The University of Northern Philippines continuously upholds its vision of equipping its faculty and staff the needed skills and competencies in this current education set-up.

UNP Training Program on *Bridging and Enhancing Skills Toward (BEST) New Normal* was a month-long training-workshop of the university faculty members on 17 September to 15 October 2021. Spearheaded by the Office of the Vice President for Academic Affairs, the training program was synchronously and asynchronously conducted via Zoom and Google classroom.

Dr. Melinda P. Bandalaria, Chancellor, University of the Philippines-Open University (UPOU), served as the keynote speaker during the opening program. As one of the backbones of distance education in the country, she stated that one of UPOU's missions is to share its sources developed by them, especially to institutions in

need of trainings on flexible learning. She also emphasized the importance of connection in this time of pandemic. "We can still be socially connected even if we are physically and geographically apart," she said.

The training program was composed of modules and lectures which were synchronously and asynchronously discussed and conducted. Module 1, which centered on *Flexible Learning in the UNP Context*, happened on 21 September 2021. Dr. Melinda Bandalaria of UPOU was the resource speaker on *Flexible Learning: A Revisit*, which covered topics on the different modes of delivering instruction. Dr. Richard Arruejo, UNP Faculty- College of Communication and Information Technology served also as a resource speaker on the topic, *A Walk through with the UNP-OLS* - the newly installed Online Learning System of the university.

Module 2 centered on the topic, *Designing Your*

Course: The Backward Design Process, with the resource speaker, Ms. Ana Katrina Marcia, Assistant Professor, of the Faculty of Education, UPOU. On the other hand, Module 3 is on *Module Writing/Course Materials Development* with Dr. Joanne V. Serrano, Associate Professor, UPOU Faculty of Management and Development Studies, as resource speaker.

Assessment in Flexible Learning Mode was the focus of Module 4, with Ms. Mari Anjelli L. Crisanto, Program Chair, Diploma in Computer Science, UPOU Faculty of Information and Communication Studies, as the resource speaker. Dr. Consuelo dL. Habito, Professor Chair, UPOU Faculty of Management and Development Studies, discussed the contents of Module 5, on *Course Delivery*.

Module 6, *Technologies In Teaching and Learning*, was discussed by Dr. Ria Mae Borromeo, Assistant Professor and Director, UPOU In-

formation and Communication Technology Development Office. Lastly, Module 7 centered on *Quality Assurance in the Flexible Learning Mode of Instruction*, with Dr. Maria Rowena Del Rosario-Raymundo, Chair, Master of Distance Education Program, UPOU Faculty of Education.

The training program ended on 15 October 2021 with Dr. Juan Primitivo Petrola, Education Program Supervisor II, Commission on Higher Education- Region 1, who discussed concepts on flexible learning and who also served as critic for presentations on syllabi and worktexts of some colleges.

Dr. Norly Domenden, OSAS Director, Urdaneta City University, and owner of Wundt Psychological Institute, also served as a keynote speaker with the topic, "Maintaining Health and Wellness in the Academe's New Normal". He emphasized the importance of balancing work and personal life, and also reiterated the idea of taking things slow despite the glorification of the idea on hustle culture.

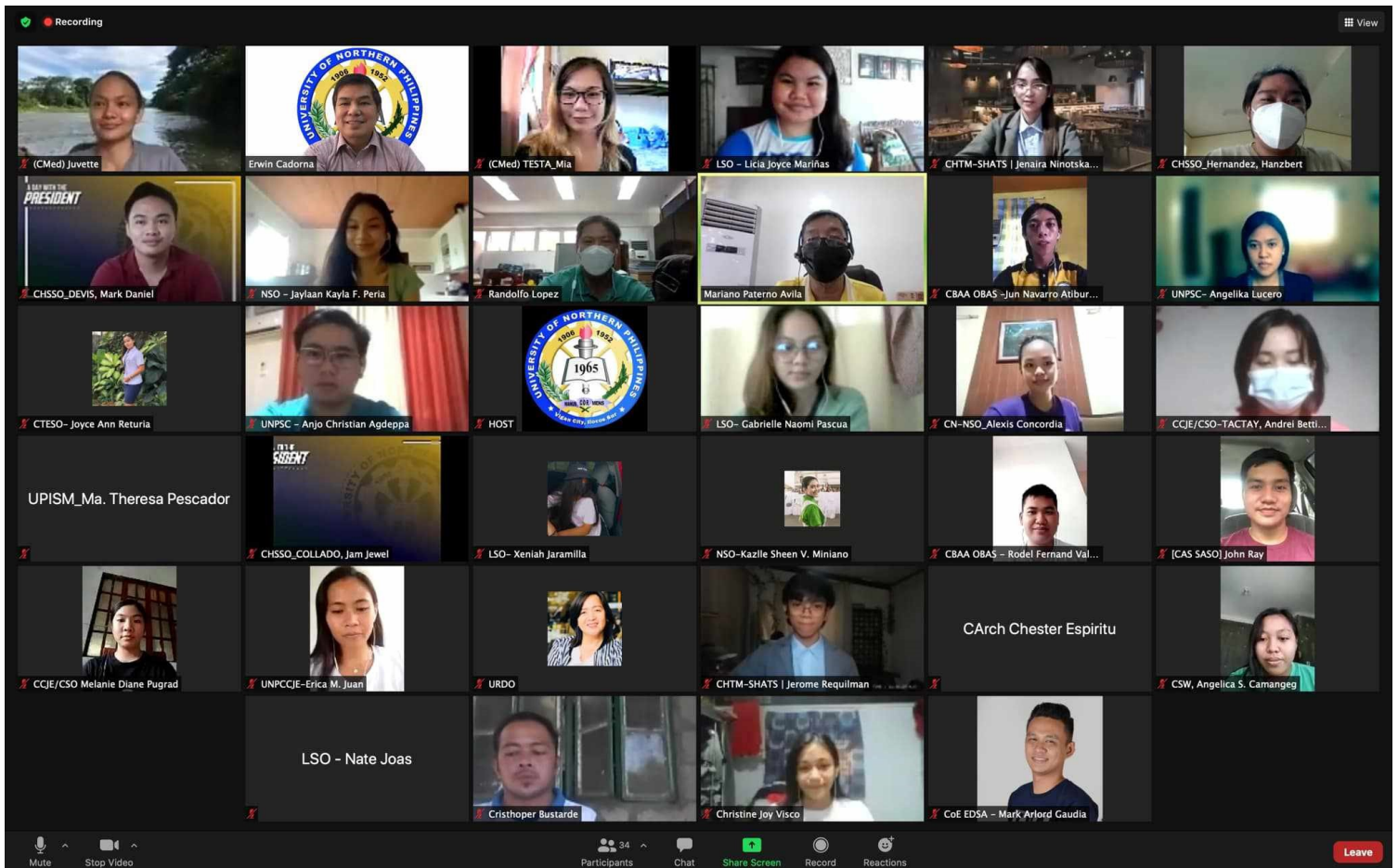

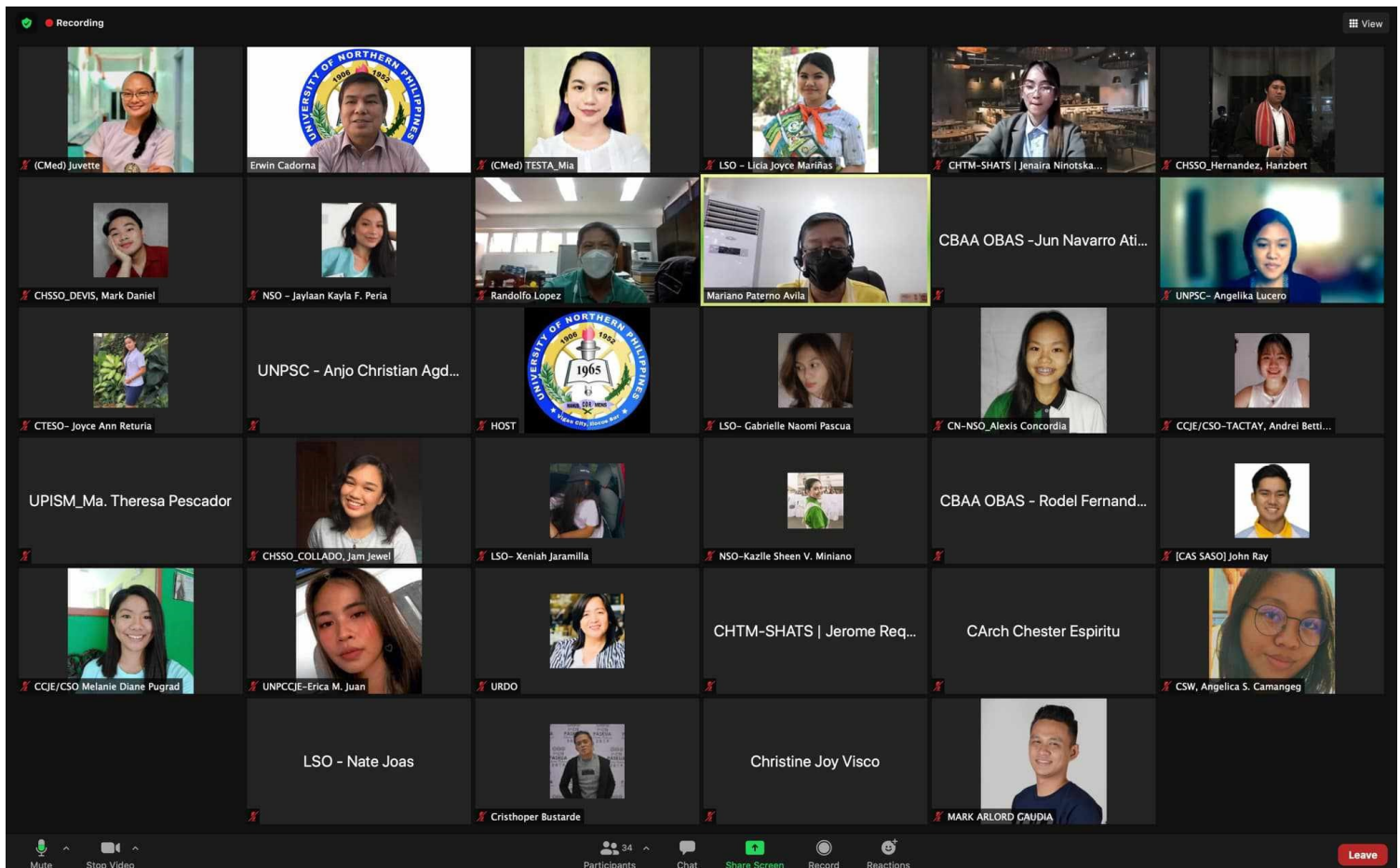
take advantage of these resources, and to actively participate in shaping their educational experience at UNP.

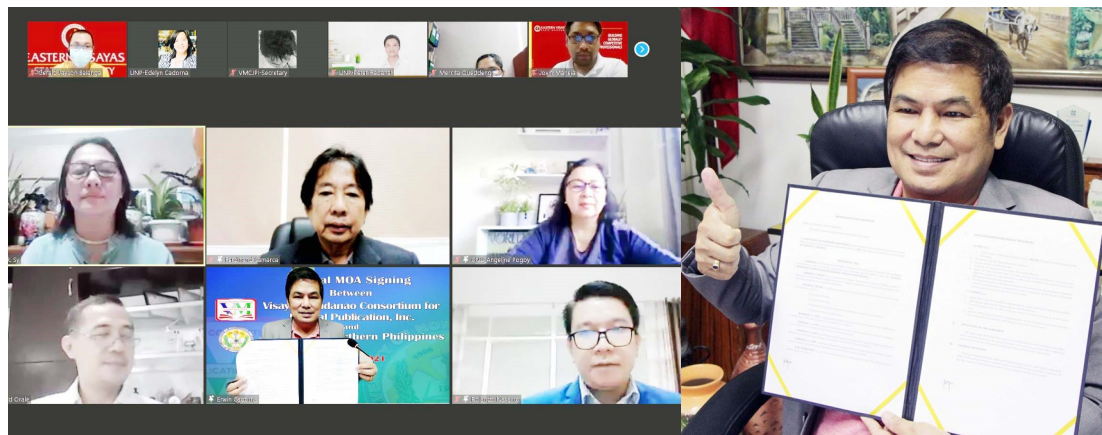
The event concluded with a commitment from Dr. Cadorna to make such interactions a regular feature of University life. He promised to establish more channels

The University of Northern Philippines continues its pursuit in sustaining the research culture in the university as it underwent Virtual Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) Signing with Visayas Mindanao Consortium for Journal Publication, Inc. (VMCJPI) on 06 August 2021.

The signing of MOA happened via Zoom and was attended by UNP officials headed by Dr. Erwin F. Cadorna, SUC President; Dr. Pio Ferdinand J. Lamarca, OIC-Office of the Vice President for Finance and Administration; Dr. Rolando B. Navarro, VP for Aca-

demie Affairs; Dr. Edelyn A. Cadorna, Director, University Research and Development Office; and other UNP faculty and staff. Also present in the MOA signing were Dr. Frances Ann R. Sy, VMCJPI Chair, and VP for Academics, Research and Instruction, Southern Leyte State University; Dr. Angeline Pogoy, VMCJPI Vice-Chair, and VP for Research, Extension, and Publication, Cebu Normal University; Dr. Ronald Orale, VMCJPI Auditor, and VP for Research and Extension, Samar State University; and Dr. Gerald Jayson Balanga of Eastern Visayas State University,

and Managing Editor, Innovative Technology and Management Journal.

VMCJPI is a consortium of Higher Education Institutions aimed at initiating activities that will propel attainment of higher accreditation level in journal publication and indexing among all its member-institutions.

Dr. Pogoy, VMCJPI Vice-Chair, stated that despite the current situation with the pandemic, there is a need to be responsive to the needs of this time, and to ensure sustainability of the vision and mission of the consortium. "May we continue to nurture

quality and excellence in our research journal publication because this is our legacy, and this is the responsibility that comes with our calling as member-institutions of this consortium."

Dr. Cadorna, in his message, also highlighted the integral purpose of research in shaping the future of any organization especially in State Universities and Colleges. He added that UNP is deeply humbled and honored as the first HEI in Luzon to be admitted in the consortium. He also expressed that through the membership in the consortium, "UNP will be properly guided and assisted in improving and in indexing our research journal". The University Research and Development Office (URDO) launched the *Asian Journal of Education and Human Development* (AJEHD) on 17 May 2021.

VMCJPI will undertake four areas of resource sharing to its members: journal publication, capacity building, utilization of research laboratories and facilities at discounted rates, and establishment of an ethics board.
